The Youth Olympic Games is an invitational international multi-sport event held every four years in staggered summer and winter events consistent with the current Olympic Games format. The age limitation of the athletes is between 14 and 18.

Beside the hockey tournament there are also separate competitions called "Skills Challenge" (fastest lap, shooting accuracy, skating agility, fastest shot, passing precision, puck control).
